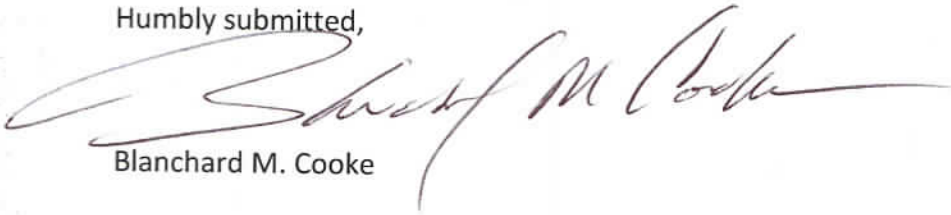
Statement of Commitment
